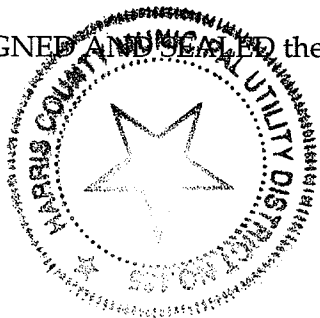
and all of said persons were present, except Director _____, thus constituting a quorum. Whereupon, among other business, the following was transacted at the meeting: a written

ORDER ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS
CONCERNING TEALBROOK PARK

WHEREAS, the District was created and organized for the purpose of providing water, wastewater, and drainage to serve the areas within its boundaries, as well as the additional purpose of providing recreational facilities to serve members of the public; and

WHEREAS, to carry out its purpose, the District has constructed certain recreational facilities to serve the community as the public park located at 20234 ½ Baron Brook Dr., Cypress, Texas (the "Park Site");

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the District finds it necessary to adopt rules and regulations relating to the use and maintenance of the Park Site to ensure the safe usage of the Park Site; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the District, under the authority of Section 25.004 of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code and Section 54.205 of the Texas Water Code, may adopt and enforce reasonable rules relating to the use, operation, management, administration, and policing of its park areas as it considers appropriate to regulate privileges on land or easements owned or controlled by the District; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF HARRIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 165 THAT:

Section 1: The facts recited above are hereby declared to be true and correct.

Section 2: Under the authority of Section 25.004 of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code and Section 54.205 of the Texas Water Code, the District hereby adopts, and considers appropriate and reasonable, the rules and regulations relating to the Park Site attached hereto as Exhibit "A" (the "Rules and Regulations").


Section 3: Any person, corporation or other entity violating the Rules and Regulations of this Order may be subject to a fine of up to \$10,000 per violation or criminal penalties, including imprisonment, or both.

Section 4: The District is hereby authorized to publish a substantive statement of these rules, regulations and penalties as required by Section 54.207 of the Texas Water Code, and such penalties described herein shall be effective and enforceable five days after publication.

Exhibit "A"

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE USE OF TEALBROOK PARK WITHIN HARRIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 165 (the "District")

1. No trespassing by unauthorized persons on Park Site.
2. No use of unauthorized motor vehicles on Park Site.
3. No use of the Park Site before sunrise or after sunset.
4. No alcoholic beverages or glass containers on Park Site.
5. No dangerous activities, including fires, fire pits, fireworks or discharge of firearms, conducted on or within thirty (30) feet of the Park Site.
6. No camping, loitering, advertising or solicitation of any kind on Park Site
7. Dogs must be on a leash at all times while at Park Site, and dog owners must clean up all solid waste deposited by their animals.
8. No dumping of any trash or other substances into the Park Site.
9. Use of play equipment permitted only as it is intended and only if safety surfacing has been maintained beneath and around the equipment.
10. Use of play equipment permitted only in a safe manner, including:
 - A. Use slides only in a safe, seated positions. Never climb "up." Exit promptly to avoid collisions.
 - B. Do not ride bicycles, skateboards, rollerblades or skates on playground equipment.
 - C. Never wear a helmet, back pack or clothing with strings while using playground equipment.
 - D. Never run or push when on the playground equipment.
 - E. Wear shoes when on playground equipment.

Any violation of these rules shall subject the violator to a penalty not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) for each violation or criminal penalties, including imprisonment, or both. Each day that a violation of any of these rules hereof continues shall be considered a separate violation.
